PREPARING FOR MY DEFERRED ACTION APPLICATION - DACA

Organize the documents you need to establish your eligibility DACA using this list.

Caution: Filing this application will bring you to the attention of Immigration, so before you file make sure you know what the consequences will be if your application is not approved.

Proof of My Identity/Date of Birth/Qualifying Age – (one is sufficient)

- Birth Certificate with English translation & Govt issued photo ID**
- Passport – current or expired; National Identity Document/Cedula – Matricula/Consular ID
- School or military ID with photo – current or past

Proof that I have been residing continuously in the U.S. since June 15, 2007

- School Records (transcripts, letter from district about months/years enrolled, report cards)
- Financial Records – bank statements, utility bills, rental contracts & receipts
- Employment Records – pay stubs, work ID card, W-2 forms
- Medical Records – appt dates, vaccination record, insurance bills, prescriptions from drugstore
- Birth certificates of children born in US
- Church Records – baptism, first communion, confirmation certificates, statement of church attendance
- Automobile license receipts or registration, car insurance, old & current licenses

Proof That I Am In School, Have a High School Diploma or GED, or That I Was Honorably Discharged From The U.S. Coast Guard or U.S Armed Forces

- School Transcript, Report Cards, Enrollment letter for GED/ESL study program
- High School Diploma/GED Certificate
- Military Discharge Papers (if applies)

AND – Prepare address list of where you have lived since entering the USA

Make a list of ALL the addresses where you have lived since entering the USA with dates you lived there. See address list worksheet.

Proof That I Do Not Have A Disqualifying Conviction And Do Not Pose a Danger to Public Safety/National Security *

- Juvenile Court Records if any
- Criminal Court Records, if any (arrest records, court records)
- You need to speak with an attorney before filing if:**
 - 1) You have a prior deportation, stop or arrest at border or within the United State, whether you went to a court or not
 - 2) You have a Arrest, citation, court hearings, or convictions/dispositions in juvenile or adult court (get the certified court docket from each case)

*If you have never been arrested and/or charged with any offense, you do not need to submit any documents to establish this. Like all deferred action applicants, you will be required to go to a biometrics appointment and have your fingerprints taken to determine if you have any arrest record
